

The Living History Center at Duportail — Phase II Campaign Committee Led by Local High School Grads

With all of the data collected from the interviews conducted last year, the Trust asked former School Board member, Kevin Mahoney, and founder and owner of Nudy's Café, Ray Nudy, to co-chair the Phase II Capital Campaign. Both said, "Yes!"

It turns out that Kevin and Ray were classmates at Conestoga High School during the mid-1970's and even played football together. David Mackey, a new member on the Trust's Board of Directors, also joined the Campaign Committee. He graduated in 1976 with Ray Nudy. Mahoney graduated a year later. They all recall the celebration of our Nation's bicentennial – the caravan of Conestoga wagons riding along Lancaster Avenue in Paoli and the transfer of Valley Forge from a State Park to a National Historical Park on July 4, 1976.

Three individuals who grew up here have come together to lead Phase II of the Capital Campaign. Their core committee includes Judy DiFilippo, Trust member and former Township Supervisor; John Sacharok, former Trust member and owner of West Chester's Golden Valley Farms Coffee Roasters; and, Bob Wise, owner of Wise Preservation Planning and founding President of the Trust.

On August 15, 2013, invited guests and friends gathered at Duportail House to learn about the *Living History Center at Duportail*. They represented past supporters, House Tour homeowners, area corporations, small local businesses, and community leaders. General Anthony Wayne, portrayed by Charles Fifer, greeted guests as they arrived.

Attendees gathered on the lawn after enjoying some conversation

and the light fare donated by Campaign co-Chair Ray Nudy. Co-Chair, Kevin Mahoney welcomed everyone and spoke about the importance of the project. He said it was our opportunity to create a place where our children and grandchildren could come to learn about the *history* that surrounds this community and to hear about the stories of the people who made it happen.

To support Kevin's message, Valley Forge National Historical Park Superintendent Kate Hammond spoke about the importance of preserving these local resources. She pointed-out it was General Louis Duportail who convinced Washington to establish the encampment at Valley Forge during the winter of 1777-1778. She mentioned the importance of those who came from foreign countries with skills that aided our cause. Duportail was an engineer, trained in the strategies of war.

Adding to the story of Duportail was Curtis A. Heckleman, a member of the US Army Corps of Engineers. He confirmed Duportail is credited as being a founder of the Corps of Engineers. Duportail's motto for the Corps was *Essayons*, ("Let Us Try"). *Essayons* remains the Corps' creed today.

General Wayne led everyone to the site of the Jones Log Barn foundation where Bob Wise spoke about what needs to be done to complete the project – bringing the logs back together to complete the structure. Upon completion, The *Living History Center at Duportail* will become a central gathering place for local history.

Mr. Mahoney announced the Campaign had already raised more than \$100,000 of its \$300,000 goal and asked the community to help in not only

reaching the Campaign's goal, but exceeding it! Nudy's Café will be donating a portion of its sales sometime this Fall, dates to be announced. Please call Judy DiFilippo at 610-688-7723 or contact any of the other Campaign Committee members if you want to become a part of this effort. As Duportail said, "*Essayons*." As Mr. Heckelman said, "Let us try!"

With much appreciation, we thank Glenna, Gretchen, Bob and John for their service and continued support of historic preservation.


A NEW LOOK FOR THE TRUST WEBSITE

On November 17, he will speak to the TE Historical Society about his longtime research of the train stations of the Main Line from Overbrook to Paoli .


